Protect the floor with a plastic sheet beneath the radiator. Place a plastic bowl underneath the closed (thermostatic) delivery valve. Have several absorbent cloths handy. Hold the valve assembly steady with a spanner while loosening (but not removing) the union nut on the radiator.
